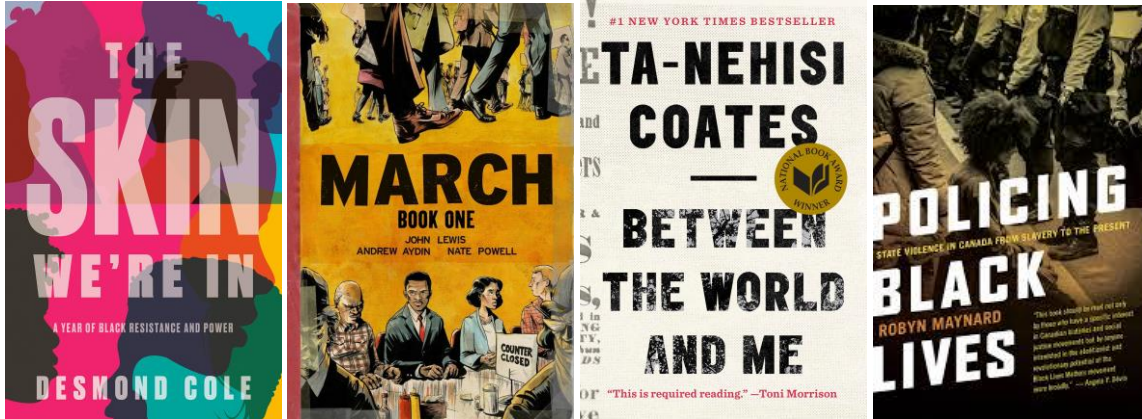


# NON-FICTION by People of Colour (adult & teen/YA)
