This decision helps the library better achieve its mission to inspire lifelong learning, provide equitable access to information, advance knowledge and strengthen our community. Eliminating fines means:

Residents unable to afford extra costs can continue to use their library

increased library membership & circulation rates. According to Calgary Public Library, "eliminating fines raised circulation, brought lapsed users back, and boosted goodwill among patrons

promoting lifelong literacy.

An example: families are encouraged to borrow a variety of books to expose children to a wide-range of stories. Families often take home over 20 books every visit! If fines accumulate, a family on a fixed income may not be able to afford fines and may avoid visiting the library again

offering equitable service.

Overdue fines are not applied to digital collections. The library wants patrons to choose their favoured formats, without worrying about costs. Having fine-free circulation for ALL collections is equitable service

Fines are unsustainable revenue. Based on declining fines revenue, which started before the fine-free pandemic, the library budgeted \$4300 in fines for 2022. Fine Free Fundraising Events can replace lost revenue. Such activities build community—allowing those with financial means to give, while not adding financial burden to those with limited funds





WHAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING

SECOND ANNUAL ONLINE SERVICE AUCTION

June 12 – 24, 2022

The second annual Friends online auction of local services donated by individuals, businesses and community organizations was held in mid-June, 2022, with a goal of \$4500 to offset the Library budget shortfall resulting from the recent elimination of all Late Fees. The event was widely publicized in social and conventional local media, and via posters throughout Mississippi Mills. We received offers of 75 services, with 57 of them being distinct. One third of these services were auctioned for above the listed value of the service. One hundred and thirty seven people bid on the auction items, and when the auction closed and our expenses were paid, we had raised \$4175 for the library. In addition, we received 2 large donations from community services that happened outside the auction, but entered the auction as donations. These totalled \$1354 which took our total to \$5256. We overshot our goal and we had such. positive feedback from both service providers and winning bidders. But, most of all, we had fun!

Book Sale: Mammoth; Great Big; Giant!

Whatever size you want to call it, our 2022 Book Sale was our best fundraiser yet! Woot!

The 2022 Book Sale was held in the Rexall Mall for three days from Friday to Sunday in late October.

The objective was to raise funds for the purchase of large print books for the Library.

After expenses the Book Sale netted slightly over \$6000, exceeding all expectations.

The Book Sale Committee was effectively chaired by Judith DiFruscio, assisted in the planning phase by seven other members. During the sales weekend, most members of Friends participated.




FIGURE 1. INCOME 2022.

This bar chart shows total income (\$) from our main funding sources for 2022.




FIGURE 2. EXPENDITURES 2022





FIGURE 3. FUNDRAISING
