Message From Our Chair, Barb Carroll

As we move towards our summer break, the Friends are in good shape. Thanks to the Annual Book Sale in October, 2024 (\$7573) and the first Christmas Book Sale in December, 2024, (\$1537), we started 2025 with a surplus in our account. As a result, before any of our major fundraisers, we were able to donate \$8,500 to the MM Public Library, \$4000 to maintain a fine free library, \$3,000 for a Self-Check Out station in Almonte, and \$1500 for a new Booking Management System.

On April 26 we presented out first big fundraiser of the year, a Staged Reading of Jackie Bennett's comedy "Get What You Need". We hosted 2 shows and, after expenses were paid, we raised approximately \$4219.

Our committees are now preparing for our next round of fundraisers, the annual online auction of local services and our first Live! @ The Library concert. The auction site goes live for "window shopping" on May 19 and the auction runs from June 9 to 20. The concert committee has hired performers for the June 1 concert and are busy organizing another fine day so we can have live music in the Library garden.

I truly appreciate the tremendous effort you all continue to put into the Friends fundraising efforts. Together we can provide the Library with the support it needs. And that makes me so proud of you all.

REVIEW OF PLAY READING

The Play Reading of GET WHAT YOU was highly successful. We sold 229 tickets, and close to \$100 worth of snacks and juices/water. Our gross income was approximately \$5735. After expenses we made \$3,700 to support library programming. The play was funny, playful, well scripted, and uplifting. The actors came together as a cohesive group and it then became magical on a rainy, dismal day. The audience loved it and many asked for more play readings. Huge thanks to: playwright and director Jackie Bennett, the cast who put their hearts into their performances, the Friends committee who pulled it together, Patrick Miller, for the photos, and Brian Ling, for working the lights.

Much of the magic of the afternoon and evening came from our event sponsor the French Kitten, owned by Nancy Cardin, who provided food for the actors between shows, and snacks and juices/water for the audience. Her efforts were greatly appreciated by audience and actors.

LIVE! @ THE LIBRARY

We hope you will be able to join us in the Library garden on Sunday, June 1st at 2:30 for another wonderful outdoor roots music show featuring a local Ottawa band called Moonfruits.

Moonfruits are presently on tour in France, representing Canada at an international roots festival of music called Changez d'Air. We are so lucky they are able to wind up their tour in France with our Live! @ the library concert series.

Moonfruits, 2024 Canadian Folk Music Award nominees (Emerging Act & December 2014), is led by two masters of musical harmony, Alex Millaire and Kaitlin Milroy, presenting songs in both French and English. For this June performance, Moonfruits will be joined with double-bassist Toby Meis.

Bring a lawn chair and settle in for some great harmonies. Hope to see you there.

Also available and popular during the sale, were carefully selected book sets, prewrapped in gift box packages. Many shoppers were delighted they came. When all was over, the sale raised \$1700, impressive for a first-time event. An awesome achievement from a motivated team of volunteers!


